**Course #1: "Advances in Bone Science and How it Relates to Periodontal Treatment and the Dental Professional." 6.0 CEUs**

**Course Description:** Participants will have a better understanding of bone as living organism and its effect on dental tissues. Videos and case studies will be utilized to show a microscopic, radiographic and clinical perspective on bone and its components. Participants will be more equipped with the understanding and rationale of bone and the epithelial attachment and its correlation to infection, disease and re-growth. The participant will also understand how bone more so than any other organ can be changed in shape and size to suit numerous purposes such as facial reshaping in preparation for implant placement and reversing gingival recession.

Upon Completion of this course, participants will understand:

- The difference between normal healthy bone and diseased bone.
- How bisphosphonate and radiation can affect bone vitality
- How bone can be reshaped to increase stability following orthodontic treatment
- The different phases of bone remodeling and how these can be stimulated to increase the speed of tooth movement three to four times faster
- The rate of bone turnover and how it can increase the rate of tooth movement
- How bone volume can predispose a patient to gingival recession, when and how gingival recession can be addressed
- How orthognathic surgery can be avoided in certain situations

**Speaker: M. Thomas Wilcko, DMD**



Dr. Tom Wilcko received a specialty certificate in periodontics from Harvard University and is a Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Periodontics at Case Western University. He maintains a private practice in periodontics in Erie, Pennsylvania. He and his orthodontist brother, Bill Wilcko, co-developed the Wilckodontics® Accelerated Osteogenic Orthodontic™ or Periodontal Accelerated Osteogenic Orthodontics™ (PAOO) orthodontic system ([www.fastortho.com](http://www.fastortho.com)). He has co-authored many peer reviewed articles, abstracts, and textbook chapters related to PAOO technique. His main research interest is periodontal aspects of accelerated tooth movement in conjunction with PAOO therapy. Other areas of research interest have included pyrophosphate tartar inhibitors, free radical stability, crestal ultrasound measurements of bone, prostaglandin precursors, bone vitality, and obstructive sleep apnea.

## ***Course #2: “Is This Going To Hurt? Overcoming Clinical Challenges in the Administration of Local Anesthesia” 3.0 CEUs***

**Course Description:** This course will offer “pearls” that can be utilized for the administration of local anesthesia. Participants will become well versed on the selection of agents that will be most effective for each individual patient. Case studies will be reviewed that focus on the adult patient with special needs, the cardiovascular patient, the pediatric patient, the pregnant/nursing mom, the patient with respiratory complications, and the fearful patients and difficult to anesthetize patients. Come prepared to leave with an arsenal of information that will equip you with the tools and information needed to ensure your patient is pain free during dental procedures.
