Healthcare and the Social Determinants of Health

Health: "Complete state of physical, mental, and social wellbeing not merely the absence of disease or infirmity" (World Health Organization, 1948). Health and illness are consequences of the interplay of biological, psychological, and social factors. There are many factors responsible for practicing and changing health behaviors, and for how people respond to illness: how they experience illness, how they seek and receive treatment, and how the cope with health issues. Those issues include: Demographics (gender, race, ethnicity, etc.), Psychological and emotional influences (how much control does a person feel about their health? how much knowledge to they have? how much stress do they experience in their lives?), and Social settings (access to health care, stressors in their environment, access to heathy food, green spaces, etc.). *Presenter: Gina Turner, Executive Director, DEI & Professor of Psychology, Northampton Community College*


Feeling the Burn(out)?
